#### Chapter 47 January Newsletter "Spot a Clock"

This month's 'Spot a Clock' is in the Milwaukee County Historical Society, located at 910 N. Old World Third Street in Milwaukee.



The building was constructed in 1913, and originally housed the Second Ward Savings Bank. Founded in 1856, among those holding controlling interest included Valentin Blatz, Joseph Schlitz and Phillip Best. These prominent members earned the institution the nickname 'The Brewers Bank'. The bank left this location in 1965, and donated the building to the Milwaukee County Historical Society, which re-opened the building to the public in 1966.




The building was designed by architects Charles Kirchhoff and Thomas L. Rose. Construction cost was \$400,000. Of this amount, \$75,000 was used to construct seven vaults for the bank. Two are located on the ground floor and can be viewed by visitors. Four additional vaults are located in the basement, and are used by the Historical Society to store books, records and other artifacts.

The vaults were manufactured by Reminington and Sherman Co. of New York and Philadelphia. Each is fitted with a three- or four-movement timer lock.



The name of the manufacturer is not visible on the exterior of any of the timer locks. However, Remington and Sherman Co. typically used timer locks produced by Yale & Towne Manufacturing Co. of Stamford Connecticut. In the late 1800s, Yale obtained watch movements from the E. Howard Company to produce timer locks. Yale transitioned to Seth Thomas as a supplier after 1900, which produced an almost exact movement
